### Gladioli

\*Classification of gladioli cultivars is in accordance with the following table which is based on the width of the bottom floret.

Miniature:	Less than 2½"
Small:	Between 2½" and 3½"
Medium:	Between 3½" and 4½"
Large:	Between 4½" and 5½"
Giant:	Over 5½"
