## The RHS Flower Fund



The RHS Flower Fund enables the RHS to continue to plant and maintain the beautiful flower displays and inspiring collections across all four gardens: Wisley in Surrey, Hyde Hall in Essex, Harlow Carr in Yorkshire and Rosemoor in Devon.

From the Amber Queen ('Harroong') of the Rosemoor rose garden and the haze of purple *Verbena bonariensis* within the Dry Garden at Hyde Hall, to the dazzling displays of candelabra primulas alongside the streamside garden at Harlow Carr, and the intense colour of the *Kniphofia rooperi* which lights up Wisley's mixed borders.

## The RHS Cherry Tree Fund



Trees play a vital part in all our lives, from moderating the climate to adding beauty, elegance and serenity. Donations to The RHS Cherry Tree Fund help the RHS maintain and plant trees within areas of woodland

and the wonderful displays within the arboretums, fruit fields, pinetums and parkland across the four gardens.

From the Japanese cherries of Lady Anne's garden at Rosemoor and the hundred year old oak trees at Harlow Carr, to the deep purple leaves of the *Fagus sylvatica* 'Dawyck Purple' in the Wisley Jubilee Arboretum and the *Malus x zumi* 'Golden Hornet' lighting up Hyde Hall's Gold Garden well into the winter months.

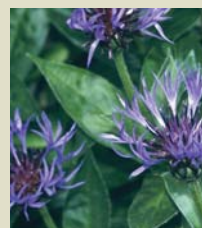
## The Hyde Hall Wildflower Fund

Donations to The Hyde Hall Wildflower Fund help to support the planting of wild flowers across the meadows of Hyde Hall's vast estate. Wild flowers, hedgerows and woodland are gradually being re-instated creating idyllic views and wonderful habitats for wildlife.

From primroses, wild red clover and oxeye daises providing splashes of colour during the spring to delicate red poppies, striking blue cornflowers and the rich yellow of the meadow buttercups which bloom in Hyde Hall's meadows across the summer. Wild flowers add a natural beauty, provide nectar for the common bumble bee and habitats for butterflies such as the meadow brown, marbled white and common blue.

## Gardens of Reflection

Every RHS garden dedicates areas of the garden where visitors can reflect on the happy times which loved ones have enjoyed at the garden. Hyde Hall's wild flowers and meadow land are dedicated to all those who have loved Hyde Hall.
