



# RHS AWARD OF GARDEN MERIT

## Vegetable AGMs 2010 (with seed suppliers)

### The AGM criteria

Intended as a practical guide for the ordinary gardener, the AGM is awarded only to plants that are:

- excellent for ordinary garden use
- available
- of good constitution
- essentially stable in form and colour
- reasonably resistant to pests and diseases
- reasonably easy to grow

### AGM hardiness ratings

Each award includes a hardiness rating, which is an integral part of the AGM, and should be included in any citation of the award:

**H1** requires heated glass

**H2** requires unheated glass

**H3** hardy outside in some regions; needs frost-free protection in winter

**H4** hardy throughout British Isles

Intermediate ratings (e.g. **H1-2**) are also sometimes given. A rating of **H1+3** means that a plant requires heated glass, but may be grown outside in summer.

### Descriptions

All descriptions in this list have been drawn up by members of the RHS Fruit, Vegetable and Herb Committee, for the most part after trial.

#### ASPARAGUS (*Asparagus officinalis*)

- 01 'Backlim' (H4) 8-10-12  
~ F1 hybrid; consistently high yield of large spears
- 93 'Conover's Colossal' (H4) 1-2-5-10-12-13-14-18-20-21-22-25-30-31-36  
~ AGM awarded to Sore's maintenance only. Early; heavy yield of good quality spears. Reconfirmed after trial 2001
- 01 'Gijnlim' (H4) 1-7-8-9-30-35  
~ F1 hybrid; early. Consistently high yield of mid green spears with purple tips

#### AUBERGINE (*Solanum melongena*)

- 95 'Bonica' (H2) 1-4-6-30  
~ F1 hybrid. Early cropping, good quality, attractive glossy-black fruits are a good size. Plants are tall, but also strong and vigorous. Reconfirmed after trial 2008
- 08 'Fabiola' (H2) 29  
~ later fruiting, vigorous plants that would benefit from staking. Good crop of attractive, long, shiny black fruits
- 08 'Fairy Tale' (H2) 32  
~ unusual and attractive. The small egg-shaped fruits are striped pale purple and cream. The short plants are suitable for growing in containers and grow-bags. Later fruiting, but would still produce a worthwhile crop if grown outside on a sunny, sheltered patio
- 08 'Falcon' (H2) 15-31  
~ early crop and high yield of good-sized, cylindrical fruits. Solid, black-skinned fruits have an attractive satin sheen. Plants have an open habit
- 93 'Galine' (H2) 1  
~ F1 hybrid. Very large, round, shiny fruit
- 95 'Mohican' (H2) 1-34  
~ F1 hybrid. Compact habit with bulbous white shiny fruit

#### BEANS

##### Broad bean, November or spring sown (*Vicia faba*)

- 93 'Aquadulce Claudia' (H4) 1-2-4-5-6-8-9-10-11-12-14-18-20-21-22-29-30-32-34-36-9-34  
~ not too tall; a good compact plant. An early crop when spring sown. Reconfirmed after trial 1999

##### Broad bean, November sown (*Vicia faba*)

- 95 'Aquadulce' (H4) 1-7-24-34  
~ dark green foliage, showing some variability. Long pods; the highest yielding in the trial

##### Broad bean, spring sown (*Vicia faba*)

- 93 'Express' (H3-4) 1-5-6-8-10-12-15-24-29-30-34-19  
~ quick maturing, with well-filled pods
- 93 'Imperial Green Longpod' (H3-4) 1-3-6-10-12-22-24-26-29-30-32-36  
~ good green colour and flavour; particularly good for freezing. Reconfirmed after trial 1999
- 99 'Jubilee Hysor' (H3-4) 1-8-10  
~ good yield; uniform, well-filled pods
- 99 'Masterpiece Green Longpod' (H3-4) 1-2-5-7-8-9-11-14-15-20-21-24-25-30-34-35  
~ slender, well-filled pods; good green colour and flavour; suitable for freezing
- 99 'Medes' (H3-4) 1-10-24-30-34  
~ high yield of uniform, good-sized pods
- 93 'The Sutton' (H3-4) 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12-13-14-15-20-21-22-24-25-30-31-32-34-36  
~ dwarf compact plants, with nice flavour; ideal for smaller gardens and windy situations. Reconfirmed after trial 1999
- 95 'Topic' (H3-4) 14  
~ early maturing; good yield. Reconfirmed after trial 1999
- 99 'Witkiem Manita' (H3-4) 1-2-3-4-7-9-14-15-20-21-24-30-32-29  
~ a good early yield, with uniform pods

~ early cropping with medium-length, well-filled pods
- Climbing French bean (*Vicia faba*)**
- 93 **'Algarve'** (flat) (H3) 1-6-8  
~ high yield; uniform mid green stringless pods. Reconfirmed after trial 2000 and 2008
- 00 **'Cobra'** <sup>(PBR)</sup> (round) (H3) 1-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-14-20-21-22-32-34-13-15-17-31  
~ very high early yield; long, fleshy; very attractive; reconfirmed after trial 2008
- 93 **'Diamant'** (round) (H3) 29  
~ stringless pods
- 93 **'Eva'** (round) (H3) 5-12-13-17-31  
~ very early. Long straight fleshy pods, wider-podded than other round varieties. Reconfirmed after trial 2000 and 2008
- 08 **'Golden Gate'** (flat) (H3) 6  
~ good crop of golden, fleshy, flat pods with a sweet, fresh flavour
- 93 **'Hunter'** (flat) (H3) 1-2-4-5-7-11-14-15-18-20-22-21-30-32-19  
~ attractive long stringless pods. Slow to show seed development. Reconfirmed after trial 2000 and 2008
- 00 **'Kingston Gold'** (flat) (H3) 18-34  
~ attractive smooth, yellow pod; uniform, slow-maturing, green-podded beans
- 08 **'Limka'** (flat) (H3) 1-9-34-13-15-17-31  
~ consistently high yields of good quality, flat, light green pods with a good flavour
- 93 **'Musica'** (flat) (H3) 1-36  
~ quick to mature, with long stringless pods; reconfirmed after trial 2008
- 08 **'Pantheon'** (flat) (H3) 7  
~ very high yield of broad, fleshy, flat pods with a sweet flavour
- 00 **'Sultana'** (round) (H3) 1-7-11  
~ early, attractive French bean type. Medium to high yield of very uniform, medium to long, mid green, reasonably fleshy beans. Does not seed too quickly
- Dwarf French bean (*Phaseolus vulgaris*)**
- 93 **'Annabel'** (H3) 1-4-5-20-21  
~ slightly curved green pods, held high in the plant; upright habit. Reconfirmed after trial 1996
- 02 **'Berggold'** (wax podded) (H3) 34  
~ attractive, clear golden, medium to long beans with slightly curved and flattened pods
- 01 **'Cantare'** <sup>(PBR)</sup> (H3) 1-29-34-13-14-17-27-31  
~ medium length, fleshy, good taste
- 93 **'Cropper Teepee'** (H3) 1-4-15-18-20-21  
~ upright habit. Mid green large pods, held high in the plant. Reconfirmed after trial 1996
- 93 **'Delinel'** (H3) 7-8-10-34  
~ strong-growing with long, dark green pods. Reconfirmed after trial 2001
- 96 **'Ferrari'** (H3) 6-7-27  
~ high yield; compact habit with straight, shortish, dark green pods
- 02 **'Golddukat'** (wax podded) (H3) 8  
~ very early; high yield of pale yellow beans with some greening. Slightly curved and flattened pods
- 96 **'Irigo'** (H3) 26  
~ very early; high yield. Upright habit; long, straight, mid green pods held high in the plant. Reconfirmed after trial 2001
- 01 **'Maja'** (H3) 19  
~ long, fat, good for slicing; the highest yield in the trial
- 01 **'Nomad'** (H3) 10-29-34  
~ medium to short, fairly pale, uniform, straight, slightly flattened pods. High yield
- 01 **'Safari'** (H3) 1-3-4-7-8-9-15-20-21-22-30-34  
~ short, slim, mid green, round, attractive pods. Low yields
- 02 **'Sonesta'** (wax podded) (H3) 1-3-10-14-15-29-34  
~ early. High yield of bright yellow, fairly long, straight, slightly flattened pods. A compact plant
- 93 **'Sprite'** (H3) 1-9-20-21-22-30-34  
~ heavy yield, with long, dark green pods
- 96 **'The Prince'** (H3) 1-2-3-5-8-9-10-12-13-14-15-20-21-22-24-25-26-34-36  
~ AGM awarded to Suttons maintenance only. Excellent yield; straight pale green pods
- Runner bean (*Phaseolus coccineus*)**
- 93 **'Achievement'** (H3) 1-15-24  
~ maincrop with long, smooth, slender pods
- 99 **'Achievement-Merit'** (H3) 1-10-29-34  
~ very long, straight, slender, smooth pods
- 06 **'Aintree'** (H3) 1-8-14-16-22-29-32-36  
~ mid season. Red-flowered, producing attractive, good quality, slim, straight, long pods with sweet flavour
- 06 **'Celebration'** (H3) 4-6-8-9-10-14-29-32-34-36  
~ high yield of attractive, straight, smooth, good quality, fleshy pods with good colour and flavour. Flowers are a decorative pink
- 99 **'Desiree'** (H3) 1-2-3-4-5-12-14-20-21-31-34-19  
~ stringless pods with thick fleshy walls
- 99 **'Enorma'** (H3) 1-2-3-4-6-7-8-9-10-14-15-20-21-22-24-30-32-34-35-13-14-15-17-20-21-30-31-34  
~ late; long, smooth, slender pods
- 06 **'Enorma-Elite'** (H3) 1-29-36-12  
~ vigorous cultivar with red flowers. Produces nice, smooth, straight beans. Sets well and has a reasonable yield
- 99 **'Lady Di'** (H3) 1-4-3-7-9-10-14-15-20-21-22-24-26-30-32-34  
~ attractive, blemish-free, long, slender pods
- 93 **'Liberty'** (H3) 1-14-15-18-20-21-22-34  
~ very long pods; a popular show variety
- 06 **'Red Flame'** (H3) 1-12-14-15-29  
~ red-flowered, setting well with smooth, long, straight pods

- 99 **'Red Rum'** (H3) 1-4-5-6-7-8-11-14-20-21-24-29-30-32-34  
~ good early and late yield; slim, straight, stringless pods, of medium length
- 06 **'Royal Standard'** (H3) 6  
~ red-flowered. Good yield of stringless beans that tend to curl, but broad and succulent with a good snap and nice flavour
- 06 **'White Achievement'** (H3) 29  
~ later cropping. White-flowered; produces a reasonable yield of dark green, fleshy pods with a strong flavour
- 99 **'White Apollo'** (H3) 1-3-9-10-16-29-30-34  
~ long, smooth, fleshy pods; excellent early and late yield
- 99 **'White Emergo'** (H3) 1-5-14-20-21-24-30-34-12-13-14-17-29-31  
~ late; smooth, tender, uniform pods, with good colour
- 06 **'White Emergo-Snowy'** (H3) 1-29-36  
~ white-flowered; straight, fleshy pods with good flavour. Continued to crop well in trial even when the temperature was high
- 99 **'White Lady'** <sup>(PBR)</sup> (H3) 1-3-4-6-7-8-11-14-15-20-21-24-29-32-34-36  
~ late; very fleshy pods
- 99 **'Wisley Magic'** (H3) 7-10-14-29-34  
~ very long pods; very high early and late yield; previously listed as 'Pulsar', a name already in use for an earlier cultivar

### BEETROOT (*Beta vulgaris*)

\* The seed of beetroot, called a cluster, is the dried seedhead of the plant, which may contain as many as three true seeds. Monogerm varieties are bred to produce one seed per cluster.

#### Beetroot varieties with long red root

- 93 **'Cheltenham Green Top'** (H4) 1-2-4-5-12-13-14-20-21-22-25-26-29-30  
~ good crop of uniformly shaped roots for late harvest; smooth skins and smooth shoulders. Good internal colour and sweet flavour. Reconfirmed after trial 2005
- 93 **'Forono'** (H4) 1-12-20-21-22  
~ open pollinated. Cylindrical, with fairly smooth skins and roots of moderate uniformity; good internal colour. Slow to bulk up. Reconfirmed after trial 2005
- Beetroot varieties with round red root**
- 93 **'Action'** (H4) 6-8-22  
~ F1 hybrid; early. Smooth uniform roots with good flesh colour and freedom from rings. Appears to have good bolting resistance. Bulks up quickly. Reconfirmed after trial 2001 and 2005
- 05 **'Alto'** (H4) 10  
~ F1 hybrid; early. Cylindrical, uniform, smooth roots with very good internal colour. Potential to bulk up well.
- 93 **'Bikores'** (H4) 1-4-14-20-21-22-27-30  
~ open-pollinated; uniform roots, with good flesh colour and freedom from internal rings. Good bolting resistance; bulked up well. Reconfirmed after trial 2001 and 2005
- 93 **'Boltardy'** (H4) 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12-13-14-15-20-21-22-26-29-30-32-34-35-36-15-19-31  
~ good bolting resistance
- 93 **'Bonel'** (H4) 1-32  
~ good flesh colour and freedom from internal rings. Reconfirmed after trial 2001
- 05 **'Boro'** (H4) 1-10-31-34  
~ F1 hybrid. Early, slightly flattened round shape. Bulk up well. Very smooth skins
- 01 **'Monodet'** (H4) 1  
~ monogerm\*; uniform roots with smooth skins and good flesh colour
- 93 **'Monogram'** (H4) 1-14-29  
~ monogerm\* with good flesh colour and smooth skins
- 93 **'Pablo'** (H4) 1-2-3-7-9-10-14-15-16-22-26-32-34  
~ F1 hybrid; very early. Uniform roots with very smooth skins; very good internal colour and freedom from

internal rings. Appears to have good bolting resistance. Widely used as a show cultivar. Reconfirmed after trial 2001 and 2005

- 01 **'Pronto'** (H4) 1-2-3-4-5-7-9-14-20-21-22-34  
~ very uniform, with smooth skins and high yield potential
- 01 **'Red Ace'** (H4) 1-7-10-16-18-22-26-32-34-12  
~ F1 hybrid; uniform roots with good flesh colour and no rings
- 05 **'Rubidus'** (H4) 10-34  
~ early; slightly flattened round shape. Fairly smooth roots with good internal colour
- 05 **'Solo'** (H4) 1-3-8-11-29-34  
~ F1 hybrid; monogerm\*. Round to slightly flattened shape. Bulks up well; smooth roots of good internal colour
- 93 **'Wodan'** (H4) 3-10-34  
~ F1 hybrid with round, slightly flattened shape. Smooth roots; good internal colour. Bulks up well. Reconfirmed after trial 2005

### BORECOLE or CURLY KALE (*Brassica oleracea Acephala Group*)

- 00 **'Afro'** (H4) 32  
~ medium height; mid green leaves, curled to the edge. Winters well
- 93 **'Bornick'** (H4) 1  
~ F1 hybrid; finely curled pale to mid green leaves. For early cropping
- 93 **'Fribor'** (H4) 1  
~ F1 hybrid; mid to dark green well-curved leaves. Winters well
- 99 **'Redbor'** (H4) 1-3-6-7-8-9-12-14-15-18-20-21-22-31-32-34-35  
~ F1 hybrid. Tall plants with open habit; strongly curled purple-green leaves. Winters well
- 99 **'Reflex'** (H4) 6-10-34  
~ F1 hybrid. Tall plants with very finely curled blue-green leaves. Winters well
- 93 **'Winterbor'** (H4) 1-2-8-20-21-22-29-30-36  
~ F1 hybrid. Tall plants with finely curled blue-green leaves; winters well. Reconfirmed after trial 1999

### **BROCCOLI, SPROUTING (*Brassica oleracea* Italica Group)**

#### **Purple sprouting broccoli)**

- 03 **'Bordeaux'** (H4) 1-2-3-7-8-11-35-12  
~ early. Compact plants which stand well over winter; fairly large heads of good colour
- 95 **'Claret'** (H4) 1-3-7-8-9-12-15-16-22-35  
~ F1 hybrid. Very tall; heavy yield of dark purple spears from March through April
- 95 **'Late Purple Sprouting'** (H4) 1-2-5-10-13-14-20-21-25-29-30-36-12-19  
~ late. Vigorous tall plants, with good yield potential, easy to pick; reconfirmed after trial 2003
- 95 **'Red Arrow'** (H4) 1-2-4-5-6-7-14-15-20-21-22-29-34  
~ early to mid season; long cropping period. Good winter hardiness; bushy, vigorous plants. Reconfirmed after trial 2003
- 95 **'Red Spear'** (H4) 1-14-29-32-14  
~ early to mid season; long cropping period. Good winter hardiness and yield; head colour fairly deep. Reconfirmed after trial 2003
- 95 **'Redhead'** (H4) 1-10-14-29-34  
~ very tall plants; a good crop of large spears of good purple colour from early March through April

#### **White sprouting broccoli**

- 95 **'White Eye'** (H4) 4-15-35  
~ tight white buds; early white spears for picking in March
- 95 **'White Star'** (H4) 1-2-4-14-20-21-29-30-32  
~ good weight; late white spears for cutting in April

### **BRUSSELS SPROUTS (*Brassica oleracea* Gemmifera Group)**

- 06 **'Abacus'** (H4) 1-16-22  
~ F1 hybrid; early to mid season. Good crop of dark green, solid, round sprouts
- 99 **'Bosworth'** (H4) 1-10-11-14-16-22-29-30-32-34-36  
~ F1 hybrid; late. Oval, mid to dark

green, solid, closely spaced sprouts. Easy to pick; plants stand well. Quality still good in February

- 99 **'Cascade'** (H4) 1-3-4-6-12-20-21-22-26-31  
~ F1 hybrid; late. Smooth, clean, well spaced, fairly round sprouts. Uniform plants which stand and yield well
- 93 **'Cavalier'** (H4) 1-12-14  
~ F1 hybrid; midseason. Dark green, well spaced sprouts. Plants produce high yields of good quality
- 99 **'Clodius'** (H4) 1-8-11  
~ F1 hybrid; midseason. Good quality, round, smooth, solid, sweet sprouts. Plants stand and yield well
- 99 **'Diablo'** (H4) 1-10-14-15-30  
~ F1 hybrid; mid season. Vigorous, uniform plant; sprouts well-spaced with good yield potential; round, medium-sized, pale green, and easy to pick. Reconfirmed after trial 2006
- 93 **'Igor'** (H4) 1-18-3-12-13-14-15-29-30-31-34  
~ F1 hybrid. Mid to late season; attractive, vigorous, uniform plants producing well spaced, solid, round, mid green sprouts. Reconfirmed after trial 2006
- 99 **'Lunet'** (H4) 1  
~ F1 hybrid; midseason. Tall plants producing a very high yield of large, oval, fairly sweet sprouts which are easy to pick and have good resistance to ringspot. Plants can lodge (lean over)
- 06 **'Maximus'** (H4) 1-2-3-4-6-7-10-13-20-21-22-30  
~ F1 hybrid; early to mid season. Uniform plants, producing a good crop of mid to dark green, smooth, solid sprouts
- 06 **'Montgomery'** (H4) 1-3-6-8-14-16-22-29-36  
~ F1 hybrid. Mid to late season; tall, uniform plants that stand well, producing a good crop of clean, smooth, round mid to dark green, well-spaced sprouts

- 06 **'Nelson'** (H4) 1-6-7-10-14-29-36  
~ F1; early. Good yield of attractive, smooth, pale green, solid sprouts
- 06 **'Oliver'** (H4) 1-2-22-30  
~ F1; early. Uniform plants producing a good crop of solid, medium green sprouts of excellent quality
- 99 **'Revenge'** (H4) 1-10-20-21-30-34  
~ F1 hybrid; late. Very uniform plants producing a good yield of solid, round, clean, mid green sprouts. Can be hard to pick
- 93 **'Roger'** (H4) 1  
~ F1 hybrid; mid season. Large, smooth, good quality, pale green sprouts. Plants stand well
- 99 **'Romulus'** <sup>(PBR)</sup> (H4) 2  
~ F1 hybrid; late mid season. Tall, vigorous plants that stand well. Good crop of attractive, clean, round, mid green sprouts. Reconfirmed after trial 2006
- 06 **'Silverline'** (H4) 9-34  
~ F1 hybrid; mid season. Tall, vigorous, uniform, clean plants, producing large numbers of mid green, round, easy to pick sprouts
- 06 **'Valencia'** (H4) 14  
~ F1 hybrid; early to mid season. Medium to tall plants producing a good yield of well spaced, large, round, mid green sprouts. Reported to have done well in organic trials at other sites
- 00 **'Wellington'** (H4) 1-4-6-9-11-13-14-20-21-22-29-30-31-36  
~ F1 hybrid; late. Very good quality smooth, dark green, round, solid sprouts

### **CABBAGE (*Brassica oleracea* Capitata Group)**

#### **Early red, non-storing cabbage (September to October)**

- 96 **'Rodeo'** (H3) 1-7  
~ F1 hybrid. Good quality; dense oval to round heads with short core; uniform. Reconfirmed after trial 2009 for September to November cropping

- 96 **'Rookie'** (H3) 1  
~ F1 hybrid; early. Round to slightly flat heads
- 93 **'Ruby Ball'** (H3) 34  
~ F1 hybrid; early. Uniform, round heads

### Autumn cabbage (September to November)

- 09 **'Buscaro'** (H3) 35-15-31  
~ F1 hybrid. Attractive dark red, oval-round, well-filled heads. Very short core, with petioles that are not too thick. Stands well
- 09 **'Castello'** (H3) 1-3-22-35  
~ F1 hybrid. Spread of maturity within rows is useful to the gardener. Ready from the end of August and standing well to the end of September. Cut and cooked when just ready, it will have a little yellow at the centre and good flavour, or can be left to mature fully for dense white cabbage that shreds well
- 09 **'Consulate'** (H3) 29  
~ semi Savoy. Attractive round, dark green, dense heads, with good flavour, for late autumn cropping
- 09 **'Minicole'** (H3) 1-2-3-6-7-9-10-12-13-14-15-20-21-22-31-34-36  
~ F1 hybrid. Good early autumn cultivar with attractive round heads. Could be spaced at 15" x 15"
- 09 **'Picador'** (H3) 1-8  
~ F1 hybrid. Good quality dense round heads with a shorter core. Flexible; can be sown from Feb to May for July to November cropping
- 09 **'Providence'** (H3) 29  
~ F1 hybrid. Mid season; nicely filled Savoy. Attractive dark green with good flavour and short core
- 09 **'Red Jewel'** (H3) 1-6-10  
~ F1 hybrid. Attractive, solid, round-headed red cabbage with upright foliage and a short core. Could be grown at a closer spacing
- 09 **'Sherwood'** (H3) 1-3-8-14-15-32-29-36  
~ F1 hybrid. Flatter round heads with a short core. Flexible; can be sown from Feb to May for July to November cropping
- 09 **'Stallion'** (H3) 2-11  
~ F1 hybrid. Very uniform, dark green heads. A solid round Savoy cross, with a shorter core and thin leaves
- ### Savoy cabbage (September to March)
- 00 **'Alaska'** (H4) 8  
~ F1 hybrid; mid season to late. Dark green, well-blistered leaves; small to medium heads. Could be grown at closer spacing for small heads. Reconfirmed after trial 2007
- 95 **'Clarissa'** (H3) 8  
~ F1 hybrid; early. Flattened round heads, with dark green leaves; solid. Good peppery flavour
- 01 **'Endeavour'** (H4) 1-8-14-29-34  
~ F1 hybrid; late. Attractive, mid green, well-blistered, medium-sized heads with good internal quality and sweet taste. Long stems
- 95 **'Famosa'** (H3) 1-10  
~ F1 hybrid; very early. Bright mid green leaves with reddish veins. Plants uniform

~ attractive, highly ornamental plants. The young leaves are mid green, becoming very dark green with a purple flush; the plants are covered with purple, orange and bright red fruits that are spicy and hot

06 'Firecracker' (H2) 1

~ very ornamental, uniform plants with small, very hot peppers that are held upright and give an attractive sunset display once they have matured beyond purple

06 'Fresno' (H2) 1-5-29-36

~ fairly short, upright growing plants; very productive. The conical fruits ripen from light green to deep scarlet red, with medium thick flesh that is very hot

06 'Fuego' (H2) 1-7-8-11-27-29-34

~ good yield of early, easy to harvest, big, red fruits. A hot pepper with thick, meaty flesh
