Thomas trained at The Inchbald School of Design in Garden Design and shortly after received Silver medal at the 2022 RHS Tatton Park for Young Designer with his garden Paradise Found. He joined Children with Cancer UK to work as their garden designer at Raines Retreat, a brand new retreat the charity is creating for families going through the unimaginable. His mission is to create a space that allows families to reconnect and take the burden of the day to day stresses faced during a cancer journey.

When a family receives the devastating news that their child is diagnosed with childhood cancer everyone in that child's life is forever changed. When a child with cancer is saved, that is indeed a precious, loved life that is saved. But that is the beginning of what is being saved. The siblings who silently, stoically push aside their own anxieties, and need for love and attention, because they know that family life now is all about treating and caring for their brother or sister with cancer.

Not only is his design a calming place to reflect, but it is fully self-sustainable, embracing local businesses and craftsmanship as well as support.

Oenothera lindheimeri 'whirling butterflies' is a key flower used. Its natural beauty and the playfulness of butterflies is a perfect match for a space aimed at children and young adults. It also inspired mum of cancer survivor and illustrator Emma van Klaveren to create a bespoke logo for the event.

The colour scheme is largely shades of green with flashed of white and palest pinks through to burgundy. A shaded seating area provides a place to relax and enjoy the scented flowers and gentle movement from the surrounding grasses.

The green comes from the evergreens Taxus baccata, Pinus mugo, Thymus vulgaris as well as Brizia media whose semi-evergreen grass with purplish tinted and blue-green leaves introduces more colour. These flowers are excellent for drying and will provide a wonderful activity for those families using the balcony.

In line with the sustainable importance of the design the garden will return to Raines Retreat where it will be used by families once the retreat opens.
