This long-standing scheme, in operation for over 60 years, not only generates approximately two million visits to garden centres and retail nurseries annually but also promotes gardening and supports charitable causes, showcasing the HTA's commitment to the industry and the community.

Proud of our industry's contributions to the economy, environment, health, and wellbeing, we actively advocate for these interests with the government. As a core member of the Environmental Horticulture Group, we collaborate with partner associations and groups representing the diverse spectrum of environmental horticulture, from domestic gardeners to large landscaping and the tree and forestry sector.

The UK's environmental horticulture and landscaping sectors are projected to significantly contribute £42 billion to the national GDP by 2030, supporting approximately 763,000 jobs. A YouGov survey commissioned by the HTA revealed that 75% of British adults have access to a private garden, and an astounding 88% agree that access to a garden or public green spaces is important to them. These statistics emphasise the industry's pivotal role in enhancing the UK population's quality of life and wellbeing.

"The plants adorning the stand will be readily available in local garden centres and nurseries, with the gift vouchers providing a convenient option to follow up on your day of inspiration from the event. It's a gift that keeps on giving!"

The stand will also display a colour palette of dark greens and undertones of the Pantone Color Insititute's Colour of the Year 2024, Peach Fuzz. A shade they describe as 'capturing our desire to nurture ourselves and others. It's a velvety gentle peach tone whose all-embracing spirit enriches mind, body, and soul.' Roses supplied by member David Austin Roses - Dannahue, Bring Me Sunshine, and Lady of Shalott will bring peachy undertones to the display.

At the heart of the stand is a beautiful wishing tree. As a supporter of the Greenfingers charity, National Garden Gift Voucher cards will hang from the wishing tree, along with the wishes of those attending the RHS Chelsea Flower Show. The tree highlights that with every NGGV card purchased, a donation is made to the charity. A collection box and QR code will be positioned beside the tree for visitors to donate once they have placed their wish.





Linda Petrons, Director of Fundraising & Communications at Greenfingers, said: "We are delighted to be represented at this year's RHS Chelsea Flower Show thanks to the HTA and their continued support through the National Garden Gift Voucher initiative.
