Having studied at the Slade School of Fine Art, Gillian later gained an MA in Art History at the University of Sussex. She has focused on botanical illustration for the past 30 years.

Gillian's work has been exhibited around the world and is now held in many of the major international collections. She has contributed to publications such as *The New Plantsman* and *Curtis's Botanical Magazine*, and spent many years teaching botanical art. Gillian took on the role of assistant artist for the RHS Orchid Committee for several years, before becoming a member of the RHS Picture Committee (now Botanical Art Judging Panel). Recent commissions include the Royal Signature painting for HM Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee (2022).

With the completion of his PhD on *Fritillaria* at Cambridge University, Martyn worked at the Institute of Systematic Botany, University of Zurich, Switzerland and at the RHS gardens at Wisley.

Martyn has been the editor of *Curtis's Botanical Magazine*, RBG Kew, since 2003. He is the longest serving member of the RHS Botanical Art Judging Panel, having joined, first as secretary, in 1978.

Deborah has been a professional botanical illustrator since leaving the National College of Art and Design, Ireland in 1991.

In 2005, Deborah became the ninth official Orchid Artist for the RHS, and has since painted over 500 orchid portraits. She also produces illustrations for RBG Kew, and regularly undertakes talks and demonstrations about her work. In 2019, Deborah was awarded the Jill Smythies Award for outstanding botanical illustration, from the Linnaean Society, London. In 2020, Deborah received the Margaret Flockton Award 1st Prize from the RBG Sydney, for her illustration of a new species of Gastrodiaorchid.

Helen was the project lead for the Transylvania Florilegium on behalf of HM King Charles and Addison Publications. Her work is held in private and public collections around the world.

After reading Botany at Oxford, followed by a Cambridge PhD, Andrew taught Biology for 30 years, before becoming a freelance botanical illustrator. He has worked for RBG Kew since 2002, producing illustrations mainly in pen and ink.


