Learning objectives	Structure	Plenary
 To record from first hand observation, experience and imagination (Art 1a) To develop their ideas (Art 1b) Choose particular colours to use for a purpose 	Introduction Introduce colour in our environment. Ask which parts of a plant might give us colour. Can they think of some colours they have seen in a garden? Ask which colour they think they would find most of in the garden. Discuss seasonal colour	Discuss parts of a plant that give us colour. Share children's work. Is there anything you would change?
 Review what they and others have done and say what they think about it (Art 3a) To explore colour in the natural environment(Art 4a) To recognise and name the parts of a plant (Sc2 3b) To find out about different kinds of plants in the environment (Sc2 5a) 	Activity 1 Divide the children into groups, giving each group a bucket labelled with a colour. Instruct each group to look for plant parts of plants which match their colour, making sure they collect as many different shades as possible. Explain that children look for the colour and ask the accompanying adults to pick small quantities from the plant. Any plant parts on the ground can be collected by the children. Each group arranges their plant material on the colour cards, so they run from light to dark shades. Hold all the cards up to form a rainbow with the children arranged around for a class photo.	Resources: • Colour cards, • sticky strips, • buckets • Card, • collage card and paper, • glue, • drawing pencils
 Assessment questions Can you name the parts of a plant? Why did you choose this colour for the flower, leaf, stem? Is this lighter or darker than? 	Activity 2 In the classroom, children use collage paper and card to create their own colourful flowers, which can be pieced together to form a garden frieze back at school. Key vocabulary: Colour, light, dark, shade, line
