Pre Lesson Activity Ideas

What comes from trees?

Brainstorm all the things that come from trees. This could be a very extensive list and could do with some research but try to get paper to be included. Web sites that might help:

Post Lesson Activity Ideas

Recycling

How is paper recycled? How is it different to normal paper production? Is it better for the planet? Can you communicate this to the school to encourage paper recycling. Do you use recycled paper at school / home?

Writing on the paper

Use the paper made at Rosemoor for creative writing or poems.

Art ideas

- Collages make collages using magazines, scrap paper, coloured paper or natural material collected from around the school
- Stain Glass using tissue paper and acetate / sticky back plastic / PVA glue.
- Tissue lanterns / sculptures using willow frames, PVA glue and tissue
- Paper mache use variety of object as frames to produce paper mache objects (e.g. balloons for masks, chicken wire for sculptures, bowls for ...bowl shapes! etc)
- Paper masks make animal, African or anything from paper. See web site for ideas: www.engagetoday.org.uk/playtime/crafts/animal-masks
- Cardboard box make a jigsaw using old cardboard. The picture could be related to paper uses, tree uses or paper making. A class exercise with each person or group responsible for cutting and painting a piece.
- *Christmas* make paper chains, cards, wrapping paper or paper mache baubles.
