## **SUMMARY:**

Generously supported by <u>Project Giving Back</u>, the grant-giving charity that supports gardens for good causes at RHS Chelsea, The King's Trust Garden: Seeding Success, has been designed by award-winning landscape architect, <u>Joe Perkins</u>.

Drawing parallels between seeds and young people, the garden showcases how plants can adapt, grow and flourish in challenging environments. The garden represents the resilience of young people and their ability to overcome adversity and thrive when given the right support.

Forms, textures and structures throughout the garden are drawn from the patterns and shapes of seeds and seed pods. Permeable, screen-printed glass panels, depicting various seed







dispersal methods, weave through the garden, symbolising the social mobility enabled by The King's Trust by helping young people facing hardship gain confidence and start careers.

Materials are either fully or partially recycled, recyclable or reclaimed and all hard surfaces and walling materials will be constructed using 'unbound' methods, eliminating the need for cement. This permeable approach is crucial for mitigating the intense rainfall events already experienced in the last few years and which are likely to continue in future.

Drifts of grasses and perennials in muted silvery greys and greens are accented with pops of colour. Structural trees and low-growing sub-shrubs such as *Ostrya carpinofolia* and *Phillyrea angustifolia* flank the basalt paths that culminate in a joyful, colourful space, reflecting the support and encouragement The Trust provides young people on their journey to employment and a stable and fulfilling life. Many of the plants are renowned for their resilience and adaptability; to grow and disperse seed within a single season or to regenerate after fire.

The King's Trust believes that every young person should have the chance to succeed, no matter what their background or the challenges they are facing. Many of the young people helped by The Trust are in or leaving care, facing issues such as homelessness, mental health problems, or have been in trouble with the law.

- 77% of young people said that having a job makes them feel as though they have stability in life
- 39% of young people have experienced a mental health problem due to being unemployed
- 84% of young people say access to green spaces (eg: parks, gardens, or nature reserves) is important for their mental health

The programmes offered by the charity give young people the practical and financial support needed to stabilise their lives, helping develop self-esteem and skills for work.

Following the show, the garden will be rehomed at Uxbridge College, West London where it will be used, developed and maintained by young people enrolled on The King's Trust programmes, other students and the local community.

The King's Trust helps tens of thousands of young people each year to build the confidence and skills they need to realise their potential. Three in four young people on King's Trust programmes move into work, education or training.

#### **GARDEN RELOCATION**

The garden will be relocated to Uxbridge College, where it will be used by students on The King's Trust programmes (Team and Achieve). The relocation of the garden to the college ensures that its benefits will extend well beyond Chelsea Flower Show. It will serve as an outdoor learning space where students can engage with horticulture and hands-on practical gardening.

The experience of maintaining and evolving the space will teach valuable life skills, from teamwork to responsibility. Emotionally, the garden provides a calming and uplifting environment, offering young people a place to reflect, connect and find inspiration. The hope of The Trust is that much like the seeds the garden celebrates will continue to foster growth, confidence and opportunity for years to come.

Joe Perkins is a multi-award winning landscape designer with almost 30 years experience designing and creating residential, commercial and public spaces in the UK, Southern France and Spain. He is a Registered Member of the Society of Garden Designers (MSGD) and an associate member of the Landscape Institute (LI).

Joe established Joe Perkins Design in 2018 and has gained a reputation for climate adaptive designs. Joe and his team share a passion for sustainable and sympathetic landscape design with a strong commitment to working within the context of place and alongside nature.

Recent projects include being awarded the highest accolade for The Shenzhen City Garden - The Community of Life at Shenzhen Flower Show 2023, a new garden space (launching 2025) at the National Trust's Grade 1 listed, historic Sheffield Park and Garden, and a current project across Europe for the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, with an emphasis on resilient and drought tolerant planting.

After involvement at the Chelsea Flower Show almost continuously since 2007, Joe earned the coveted title of the first ever designer to be awarded a gold medal, best in category and best construction for his debut show garden in 2019 with the 'Beyond the Screen' garden sponsored by Facebook and went on to earn a second Gold medal for 'Growing the Future' sponsored by Meta in 2022.

#### **About Project Giving Back**

Project Giving Back (PGB) is a unique grant-making charity that provides funding for gardens for good causes at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show. PGB was launched in May 2021 in response to the Covid-19 pandemic and its devastating effects on UK charitable fundraising - effects that have since been exacerbated by the cost of living crisis.

PGB will fund 10 gardens at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show in 2025 and intends to fund a total of 60 gardens inspired by a range of good causes from 2022 to 2026.

PGB aims to boost UK-based good causes by giving them an opportunity to raise awareness of their work at the high-profile RHS Chelsea Flower Show, as well as supporting the relocation of the gardens to permanent homes after the show where they can continue to benefit the charities and their communities.
