

Welcome

Whether you're a new member of the RHS or have been with us for many years, your membership benefits (see pp6-7) bring you inspiration and know-how to help

you get the most enjoyment from your gardening. Your membership also contributes to our vision of a world where gardening is embraced as a way of life – a source of joy and fulfilment, building healthier lives, stronger communities and thriving environments.

Wherever people are gardening, we want to support them. Community gardening can transform unloved spaces into flourishing hubs for wellbeing, biodiversity and social connection. We're using the learnings from our first-ever community gardening survey conducted last year to create a new strategy to share knowledge and best practice with many more growing and gardening groups.

We're here for people throughout their gardening journey, which begins in childhood, and our Campaign for School Gardening provides free teaching resources, training and an awards scheme. Through free school visits to our gardens and opportunities to take part in our shows, we're finding ways to engage young people in gardening.

We also opened Greener Skills Gardens at RHS Wisley and RHS Bridgewater last year to demonstrate sustainable gardening methods and offer hands-on practice for people who've never tried gardening before.

Two exciting brand-new shows this July are bringing the best in horticultural inspiration to different parts of the UK. RHS Badminton Flower Show 2026 is set within south Gloucestershire's beautiful Badminton Estate and RHS Sandringham Flower Show takes place at the Norfolk retreat of Their Majesties King Charles III and Queen Camilla.

"The RHS wants to support people, wherever they are gardening" In 2026 in addition to wonderful gardens and great gardening ideas, we're focusing on biodiversity and nature, sharing expert advice about how to make your garden even greener, reduce your carbon footprint and provide vital habitats for wildlife. We're adopting more sustainable gardening methods and regularly monitoring wildlife at RHS Gardens too.

There's plenty to look forward to at RHS Gardens. The reimagined Oudolf Landscape at RHS Wisley has matured wonderfully and new bulb plantings will give a spring hit of colour. The expanded RHS Rosemoor Winter Garden has recently opened, and at RHS Harlow Carr you can see how the new landscape around the Harrogate Arms is developing. The iconic Rose Rope Walk at RHS Hyde Hall has been given a sturdier structure to ensure longevity and the roses will be replanted this spring. Work continues at RHS Bridgewater on the Chinese Scholars Garden, a series of four traditionally crafted pavilions, due to complete this autumn.

There are 18 new RHS Partner Gardens this



Covering 154 acres in Salford's historic landscape, RHS Garden Bridgewater is constantly evolving and inspiring visitors and a valuable community resource. The masterplan, created by landscape architect Tom Stuart-Smith, was brought to life by our fantastic RHS Bridgewater team and award-winning garden designers. Its concept of 'gardens within a garden' blends history with world-class horticulture.

The restored Weston Walled Garden, one of the UK's largest Victorian walled gardens, showcases Mediterranean, Asiatic and North American planting in the peaceful Paradise Garden. In contrast, the contemporary Worsley Welcome Garden includes beech topiary, yew domes and billowing perennials.

At the centre of the Chinese Streamside Garden, a stunning Music Pavilion is the first of four classical Chinese pavilions forming the Scholar's Garden, opening in 2026. A 'bambusarium' with nearly 70 bamboo cultivars was added in 2025.

Both beautiful and productive, the Kitchen Garden offers inspiration for growing food in spaces of all sizes, while the naturalistic Orchard Garden is a haven for wildlife and biodiversity. Opened in 2025, 'Air' is the first of four new borders inspired by the elements, with 'Earth' to follow in 2026.

In our three community gardens – Community Grow, the Wellbeing Garden and Peel Learning Garden – local groups and school children grow food and develop their gardening skills.

The year-round events programme includes a host of fun family activities during the school holidays, plant fairs and exhibitions, horticultural talks and craft workshops, with seasonal highlights such as RHS Glow and Plot to Plate.

RHS Garden Wisley is the historic home of the RHS and one of the UK's most popular and cherished gardens. Within its more than 200 acres is a huge diversity of gardens and one of the world's largest plant collections.

It's a perfect year-round destination with swathes of spring bulbs and pretty blossom, stunning mixed summer borders, spectacular autumn colour in the woodland and arboretum, and enchanting frost-dusted winter scenes, with a dedicated Winter Walk. Planting schemes are constantly evolving, so there's always something new to inspire and excite.

Opened in 2025, the Greener Skills Garden is packed with sustainable gardening ideas backed by RHS research. In the Oudolf Landscape, opened in 2024, you can wander among the


breathtaking tapestry of perennials and grasses, with spring bulbs added for 2026.

Much-loved areas, such as the Rock Garden, Battleston Hill and Exotic Garden, continue to thrive and thrill. Full of diverse culinary delights, the World Food Garden champions growing food using sustainable practices, while the impressive Glasshouse is home to a vast range of tender plants and an Orchid House.

RHS Hilltop – The Home of Gardening Science is the UK's first dedicated centre of horticultural scientific excellence and shines a light on current RHS research, while the Laboratory reveals RHS Wisley's rich history.

There's ample space for kids to run, play and explore, with natural play features in the Back to Nature Garden a highlight for families.

Set in the stunning Torridge Valley in north Devon, between Dartmoor and Exmoor National Parks, this 65-acre haven of biodiversity offers something for everyone. Explore our renowned 'garden rooms', each themed to celebrate the seasons with distinctive planting styles and designs.

Our two rose gardens, featuring more than 250 cultivars, reach their fragrant peak in June. In summer, experience sizzling colour in our Hot Garden or unwind in the Cool Garden, with its soft pastel shades and teardrop-shaped pond.

Completed in summer 2025, the reimagined Winter Garden by award-winning garden designer Jo Thompson doubles the space dedicated to winter interest, blending classic winter planting with more unusual trees, perennials and grasses.

In the historic Lady Anne's Garden, our Exotic Garden, Stone Garden, Mediterranean Garden and Cherry Garden offer lots of inspiration for different conditions and gardening styles.

Take a streamside walk from the Lake, through the Rock Gully to the Bog Garden and enjoy pools, waterfalls and moisture-loving plants. Explore our woodlands, wildflower meadows and the Fruit and Vegetable Garden for practical growing ideas. Discover trees from the Northern Hemisphere in the Bicentenary Arboretum and admire our collection of rare and local heritage apples in the orchards.

Families can let their imaginations run wild exploring our woodland walks, two play areas, a den-building area and leaf-rubbing trail.

Discover year-round events and activities to suit all ages and interests, with a range of inspirational short courses and workshops throughout the year, as well as a flower show, plant shows, craft fairs, sculpture and art exhibitions. Situated in the heart of rural Essex, RHS Hyde Hall's 365-acre site makes it the largest of the five RHS Gardens and one of the most visited attractions in the East of England. Its unique hilltop location offers big open skies, sweeping panoramas and far-reaching views across the surrounding countryside. The inspiring mix of horticultural styles provides year-round interest and planting themes range from traditional to modern. You'll be enchanted by the exciting spaces, natural beauty and colourful blooms.

The quintessential Hilltop Garden with its scented Rose Garden and colour-themed Herbaceous Border is full of English charm, while in stark contrast the Dry Garden is packed with more than 400 drought-resistant

plants from Mediterranean regions. The Rose Rope Walk, one of Hyde Hall's original features, was lovingly redeveloped in 2025.

Brightening even the dullest days, the Winter Garden celebrates the extraordinary colours, textures and scents of plants in winter. In the Global Growth Vegetable Garden, discover a mouthwatering showcase of edibles from around the world.

A sea of swaying grasses and perennials fills the large serpentine beds of Clover Hill, and favourite garden plants spill out from borders and over the paths of the Cottage Garden.

Families and children are encouraged to explore winding paths, roll down hills and run in wide-open spaces. Nestled in the trees is Higgledy Hyde, a wooden adventure play area.

Sitting on the doorstep of the Yorkshire Dales, this 58-acre family-friendly garden offers streams and lakes, woodland and wildflower meadows, generous prairie-style planting and moisture-loving plants, reflecting and celebrating its location. There are delights in every season, from snowdrops and spring rhododendrons in the Woodland to magnificent summer and autumn border displays, and a colourful, fragrant Winter Walk.

In the heart of the garden, the cool, moist banks of Streamside host an exciting mix of plants, including a wonderful display of candelabra *Primula*, *Meconopsis* and iris in early summer. The refreshed Main Borders provide spectacular colour from bold drifts of perennials and grasses, while the vibrant Sun Border dazzles all summer.

Enjoy lake views from Thaliana Bridge and explore exoticstyle planting in the Sub-Tropicana Garden, where we push the boundaries of what can be grown in North Yorkshire. Recently revived, the Sandstone Rock Garden peaks in autumn with collections of Japanese maples and conifers.

The Kitchen Garden offers inspiration for growing fruit and veg, including local and heritage varieties, and garden produce can be savoured in the refurbished Harrogate Arms café. Exquisite alpine plants bring year-round colour to the Alpine House and limestone rockery completed in 2025. Connect with nature in the tranquil Arboretum with a wildflower meadow.

For children there's the Craggle Top Tree House, Logness Monster, Spiders Nest and a new mud kitchen.







Recognised by English Heritage, the 10-acre landscaped gardens are in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. There is a woodland garden with fine azaleas and rhododendrons, extensive herbaceous borders, cloud yew hedges, a folly, a rock

garden and a wobbly tower with fine views over the gardens and parkland.







Englefield Gardens

The gardens date back than 400 years. Stone balustrades and staircases were made by Italian craftsmen in the 1860s, and in 1936 the woodland garden was created by thinning the forest, a stream was built and camellia, rhododendron, azalea, magnolia, parrotia,

cornus, davidia and acer were planted. The Lower Terrace was redesigned in 1974 by American landscape architect Lanning Roper. Roses, perennials and a changing palette of annuals fill the box borders and wildflower areas attract butterflies in summer.

Farringford gardens reflect the period of the poet Alfred Lord Tennyson who lived here 1853–1892. Cottage-style planting within the walled garden consists of mixed herbaceous borders containing old rose cultivars. There are some Isle of Wight

apples, heritage fruit and vegetables, a small woodland and parkland walk.
