The following list contains the delphinium cultivar and cultivar-group names, which have been registered between 1st January 2014 and 31st December 2014. Raisers and introducers of new delphiniums are urged to ensure that the names of all their plants have been registered.

In the list below \underline{R} = raiser, \underline{H} = hybridiser, \underline{G} = person who grew the plant to its first flowering, \underline{S} = selected by, \underline{N} = person naming the plant, \underline{I} = introducer, \underline{REG} = registrant.

Colour codes such as '101C' or '4C' refer to the RHS Colour Chart (1966, reprinted 1986, 1995, 2001, 2007).

'Angela Rowe'

(Parentage unknown) \underline{H} (2000), \underline{G} (2003), \underline{N} (2014), \underline{I} (2014) & \underline{REG} (2014) by Dr. R.C.G. Rowe.

Stems tall (1.98m). Foliage deeply divided. Spikes 99cm, tapering to apex, with four moderately vigorous laterals. Flowers semi-double, 80mm wide, light blue 101C; eye greenish white 157D, with some blue stripes, with hairs light greenish yellow 4C; spur 5mm long; pedicel 25mm long. Elatum group.

The registrant notes the clarity of colour with almost complete elimination of pink discolouration in the sepals and a good, regular spike form.

Etymology: Named for the registrant's wife.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0126381).

'Sandling Purple'

(Sdlg 1/86/3 \circlearrowleft × sdlg 9/81/2 \circlearrowleft) \underline{H} (1988), \underline{N} (2014), \underline{I} (2014), \underline{REG} (2014) by Dr. R.C.G Rowe. Stems medium (1.53m). Foliage usually divided. Spikes 72cm, blunt at apex, with three short laterals. Flowers semi-double, 83mm wide, dark purple 83B; eye greenish white 157D, with hairs brilliant greenish yellow 7D; spur 7mm long; pedicel 30mm long. Elatum group.

The registrant notes the rich colour, dense, well-formed eye and good floret form.

Etymology: Named for the strip of land along the Suffolk coastline on which the registrant gardens. Nomenclatural standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0126354).





'Summerfield Catherine'

Stems medium (1.68m). Foliage pale to mid green. Spikes 100cm, tapering to apex, with numerous upright laterals. Flowers semi-double, 80mm wide, purplish pink 75A at outer edge of floret, paling to 75D towards centre; eye deep brown; spur 25mm long; pedicel 80 – 90mm long. Elatum group.

The registrant notes the late flowering (July onwards).

Nomenclatural standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0126383).



'Summerfield Irene'

(Un-named white sdlg \hookrightarrow 'Sandpiper' \circlearrowleft) \underline{H} (1990), \underline{G} (1991), \underline{N} (2014), \underline{I} (2014), \underline{REG} (2014) by Mrs S.E. Bassett.

Stems medium (1.6m). Foliage mid green. Spikes 75cm, tapering to apex, with 4-5 long, well-spaced laterals. Flowers semi-double, 65mm wide, clean white; eye deep honey-colour; spur 25mm long; pedicel 70mm long. Elatum group.

The registrant notes this cultivar holds its florets, has a slightly protruding eye and is a long-lived plant.

Etymology: Named for a family member of the registrant.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0126384).



'Summerfield Orion'

(Un-named dark blue sdlg $\ ^{\bigcirc}$ × un-named mid-blue sdlg $\ ^{\bigcirc}$) $\ ^{\underline{H}}$ (2000), $\ ^{\underline{G}}$ (2001), $\ ^{\underline{N}}$ (2014), $\ ^{\underline{I}}$ (2011), $\ ^{\underline{REG}}$ (2014) by Mrs S.E. Bassett.

Stems medium (1.5m). Foliage mid green. Spikes 68cm, tapering to apex, with a large number of long, upright laterals. Flowers semi-double, 60mm wide, vivid purplish blue 99C; eye white with a few yellow hairs and occasional blue stripes; spur 20mm long; pedicel 80mm long. Elatum group.

The registrant notes the very dark stem and late flowering (mid July).

Etymology: Named for the capsule expected to travel to Mars.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0126382).



Summerfield Rosetta'

(Un-named pink sdlg \circlearrowleft × un-named cream sdlg \circlearrowleft) \underline{H} (1990), \underline{G} (1991), \underline{N} (2014), \underline{I} (2014), \underline{REG} (2014) Mrs S.E. Bassett.

Stems tall (1.8m). Foliage dark green. Spikes 80cm, tapering to apex, with 3-4 long laterals. Flowers semi-double, 68mm wide, light reddish purple 74C, paling to moderate purplish pink 74D towards the eye; eye white with yellow hairs and occasional pink stripes; spur 25mm long; pedicel 75mm long. Elatum group.

The registrant notes the dark stems, how the florets hold their colour well in sunlight and tend to reflex with age.

Etymology: Named for the spaceship that reached the 67P comet in 2014.

Nomenclatural standard: colour transparency supplied by the registrant (WSY0126385).
