

## **The 19th Supplement (2023) to the Delphinium Register International Delphinium Registrar – Melanie Underwood**

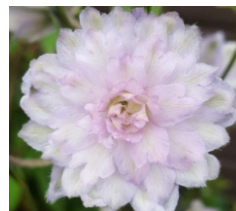
Raisers and introducers of new delphiniums are encouraged to ensure that the names of all their plants have been registered. There is no fee for registration or, if requested, for the Registration Certificate.

The following list contains the delphinium cultivar names registered between 1st January 2023 and 31st December 2023. R = raiser, H = hybridiser, G = person who grew the plant to first flowering, S = selected by, N = person naming the plant, I = introducer, REG = registrant. Colour Chart numbers in descriptions e.g., violet-blue 94B, are from the RHS Colour Chart (1966, 1986, 1995, 2001, 2007, 2015) unless otherwise stated.

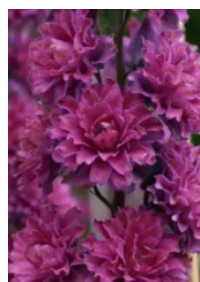
**D. 'Coadelbol'** <sup>PBR(EU)</sup> [**Highlander Series**] (BOLERO)  
**H, G, N, I** by Tony Coakley, **REG** (2024) by Lynn Coakley  
Tall; flowers double, petals lavender-blue, with eye cream-white



**D. 'Coadelcha'** <sup>PBR(EU)</sup> [**Highlander Series**] (CHA CHA)  
**H, G, N, I** by Tony Coakley, **REG** (2024) by Lynn Coakley  
Flowers double, petals pale lilac



**D. 'Coadelfla'** <sup>PBR(EU)</sup> [**Highlander Series**] (FLAMENCO)

Flowers double, petals soft pink, with green eye



**D. 'Coadelsam'** <sup>PBR(EU) applied for</sup> [**Highlander Series**] (SAMBA)

Flowers double, petals bright white, with light green eye



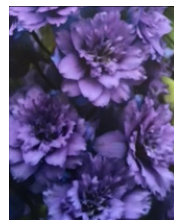
**D. ‘Coadelsur’** <sup>PBR(EU)</sup> [**Highlander Series**] (PURPLE SURPRISE)

Tall; flowers double, petals lilac-blue, frilly; eye creamy white



**D. ‘Flocrysdel’** <sup>PBR(EU)</sup> (Highlander Series) (CRYSTAL DELIGHT)

Flowers double, petals lilac, touched light green along midrib; eye green



**D. ‘Flodelpie’** <sup>PBR(EU)</sup> [**Highlander Series**] (BLUEBERRY PIE)  
**H, G, N, I** by Tony Coakley, **REG** (2024) by Lynn Coakley  
Tall; flowers double, petals lilac-blue, frilly, outer petals blue; eye greenish white



**D. ‘India Rebecca’** Elatum hybrid  
Parentage unknown  
**H** (2015?); **G** (2016?); **N, I & Reg** (2023) by Howard R. Norton  
Stem height to 1.3m. Foliage dark green, typical of *D. elatum*.  
Spikes 0.5m long, tapering to apex, up to seven laterals per stem.  
Flowers semi-double, 70mm wide; sepal colour closest to “mallow” purple 630/1\*, darker in tone towards margins; eye colour white, touched honey-coloured; spur 30mm long; pedicel 75mm long. Florets overlapping along stem. Flowering throughout June  
Etymology: named for hybridiser’s granddaughter

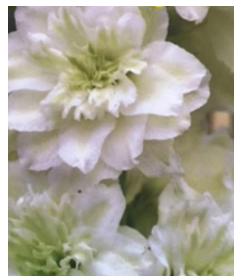
***D. 'Moon Light'*** <sup>PBR(EU)</sup> [**Highlander Series**]

**H, G, N, I** by Tony Coakley, **REG** (2024) by Lynn Coakley  
Tall; flowers double, petals creamy yellow, with pale greenish midrib and outer petals touched blue-lilac at margins, maturing to blueish lilac, with greenish midrib; eye green



***D. 'Morning Sunrise'*** <sup>PBR(EU)</sup> [**Highlander Series**]

**H, G, N, I** by Tony Coakley, **REG** (2024) by Lynn Coakley  
Tall; flowers double, petals creamy white, touched green long midrib; eye green



***D. 'Rebecca'*** Elatum hybrid

Parentage: 'Walton Gemstone' × 'Ruby Wedding'

**H** (2018), **G** (2019), **N, I & REG** (2023) by Graham Austin, Home Farm Plants

Stem height to 1.8m. Foliage mid-green, typical of *D. elatum*. Spikes 0.8m long, tapering to apex; lateral spikes 3–5 per stem, of average vigour. Flowers semi-double, 70–75mm wide; petals violet blue (A89) with outer petals becoming blue (A99) at maturity; eye colour off white, hairs yellow. Flowering mid to late season

Etymology: named for hybridiser's daughter

Nomenclatural standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0170591)

**D. 'Siri'** Elatum hybrid

Parentage unknown

**H** (2015), **G** (2016), **N, I & REG** (2023) by Howard R. Norton

Stem height to 1.63m. Foliage dark green, deeply serrated. Spikes 0.65m long, tapering to apex, nine laterals per stem. Flowers semi-double, 70mm wide, the outer sepals blue-violet 94B, the inner sepals suffused with light blue 101C; eye white, striped violet-blue 94B (centre green at first opening); pedicels 75mm long; spurs 25mm long  
Good regular placement of florets along stem

Flowering late May to early July, with second flowering in September

Etymology: named for hybridiser's granddaughter-in-law

Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0170942)

**D. 'Willow Lil'** Elatum hybrid

Parentage unknown

**H** (2015), **G** (2016), **N, I & REG** (2023) by Howard R. Norton

Stem height to 1.75m. Foliage typical of *D. elatum*. Spikes 0.7m long, tapering to apex, up to 11 laterals per stem. Flowers semi-double, 70mm wide; the outer sepals blue-violet 94B, with blue-violet N88A at margin; eye creamy white with yellow hairs, touched blue-violet at base; pedicels 65mm long; spurs 25mm long

Closely formed florets along stem

Flowering late May to early July, with second flowering in September

Etymology: named for registrant's granddaughter

Nomenclatural Standard: colour print supplied by registrant (WSY0170938)
