## INTRODUCTION

The second edition of the *International Rhododendron Register and Checklist* included accounts of all plants whose names had been registered up to the end of December 2002. The first seventeen Supplements included names registered from 1 January 2003 to 31 December 2022. This *Eighteenth Supplement* includes all those registered in 2023.

The layout of each entry follows the format adopted in the 2004 *Register and Checklist* and is explained there in detail on pages 7–10 of the Introduction.

Fls 11/domed truss, open funnel-shaped, 47–50 × 60mm, with 5 emarginate lobes, buds vivid red (57A) opening inside pale purplish pink (56A), paler at centre, with red spots on the dorsal and adjacent lobes; outside deep purplish pink (64D); filaments cream, with brown anthers; style cream, with red brown stigma; unscented. Calyx apparently absent. Lvs oblong, 160 × 50mm, cuneate at base, broadly acute at apex, with downcurved margins, moderate olive green (137A) above, with brownish orange (171B) indumentum below, prominent on the midvein, diminishing alongside veins and between veins. Shrub 2.3 × 1.9m in 22 years. Early season (April in central North Carolina, USA). Hardy to –23°C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162773).

Etymology: named for the Scot who was the hybridiser's first ancestor to arrive in North America

Fls 12/conical truss, open funnel-campanulate, 55 × 70mm, with 5 flat-edged lobes, buds strong purple (80B), opening inside very pale purple (75D) in the throat, shading to deep purplish pink (78C) at margins, with a large blotch of orange-yellow (163A/B) markings on the dorsal lobe, with some scattered markings across the adjacent lobes; outside light purple (75A); filaments white, with creamy white anthers; style white, with red stigma; unscented. Calyx absent. Lvs broadly ovate, 110–120mm long, rounded at base, broadly acute at apex, with flat margins, semi-glossy above. Shrub 1.35 × 0.75m in 12 years. Late May (in Denmark). Hardy to at least –20°C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162882).

Etymology: named for a granddaughter of the hybridiser

Fls 2–3/terminal bud, 30 × 61mm, saucer-shaped, with 5 wavy-edged lobes, buds white, opening white, with a sparse scattering of light yellow-green spots on the dorsal lobe of some flowers; outside white; filaments white, with brown anthers; style white, with green stigma; unscented. Calyx 7mm long, strong yellow-green (144A/144B). Lvs elliptic, 25 × 13mm, cuneate at base, broadly acute at apex, with flat margins, moderate olive green (147A) above. Shrub

0.9 × 0.9m in 10 years. Midseason (early May in Washington, D.C. area). Hardy to –18°C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162787).

Etymology: named for a granddaughter of the hybridiser. Breeder's code: JL-09-19

Fls 2–3/terminal bud, 30 × 61mm, saucer-shaped, with 5 wavy-edged lobes, buds purplish pink blends (61D/62A) opening inside with highly variable combinations of deep purplish pink (61D) and strong purplish pink (62A) OR sometimes completely strong purplish red (58C) OR sometimes with irregular white margins; all with deep purplish red (61A) spots on the dorsal and adjacent lobes; outside purplish pink blends (61D/62A); filaments and style correspond to predominant lobe colour; anthers dark; most stigmas are green; unscented. Calyx 7mm long, strong yellow-green (144A). Lvs elliptic, with some puckering, 30 × 15mm, cuneate at base, broadly acute at apex, with flat margins, moderate olive green (146A) to moderate yellow-green (146B) and semi-glossy above. Shrub 1.1 × 1.1m in 10 years. Midseason (early May in Washington D.C., USA area). Hardy to –18°C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162788).

Etymology: named for a daughter of the noted azalea specialist Carolyn Beck

Fls 7–10/domed truss, open funnel-shaped, 50 × 65mm, with 5 wavy-edged lobes (pinched apically to give an emarginate appearance); buds vivid reddish purple (N74A) opening inside very light purple (75C), with a darker tone along the midvein and with strong red (53C) spotting on the dorsal and adjacent lobes; outside opening very light purple (75C), becoming very pale purple (75D); filaments cream, anthers cream, with a brown ring at tip; style cream at base, shading to red brown at apex, with red brown stigma; unscented. Calyx 2mm long, moderate olive green (137A). Lvs elliptic, broadly upangled from the depressed midrib, 100–120 × 40–50mm, rounded at base, broadly acute at apex, with margins wavy and downcurved, moderate olive green (137A) and matt, with sparse white hairs above, thinly matted with orange-yellow (163A–B) hairs below. Shrub 0.5 × 1.2m in 16 years. Midseason (early to mid June on coastal Newfoundland Island). Hardy to –20°C.

Fls 8/loose ball truss, 70 × 100mm, broadly open funnel-shaped, with 7 wavy-edged lobes, buds pale green, with touches of pink, opening inside white, with green at base and with some light, grey brown spotting on the dorsal and adjacent lobes; outside white, overlaid with pink at the midribs; filaments pale creamy white, anthers grey brown; style pale green, stigma bright green; pleasant, spicy scent. Calyx negligible. Pedicels dark pinkish red. Lvs oblanceolate, 120 × 50mm, rounded at base; acute at apex, with wavy margins, glossy, mid-green with greenish yellow midrib above, no indumentum below; petioles flattish, bright greenish yellow. Shrub 2.0m × 1.5m in 10 years. October to November (in Taupo, New Zealand). Reasonably hardy. Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162604).

Etymology: named in memory of a valued volunteer and life member of the Waipahihi Botanical Gardens. A rare elepidote/lepidote cross

Fls 8(–10)/loose truss, funnel-campanulate, 80 × 95–100mm, with 7 very wavy-edged lobes and with the lobe margins recurved, buds moderate red (N34C), opening inside light yellow (11B), paling to margins, with vivid red (46B) at the base of each lobe; outer lobes light yellow (11B); filaments yellow, with brown anthers; style yellow, with light green stigma; subtle scent. Calyx 13–15mm long, light yellow (11B) outside, inside light yellow (11B), tinged with vivid red (46B). Lvs elliptic, 123 × 50mm, asymmetrically cordate at base, acuminate at apex, with wavy margins, matt above. Shrub 2.0 × 1.5m in 5–10 years. Late June (in Limavady, Northern Ireland). Hardy to –15C. Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162608).

Etymology: named for a hill, local to the registrant

Fls 13/strongly domed truss, tubular funnel-shaped, 40 × 60mm, with 10–12 flat-edged lobes, buds strong yellowish pink (37A), opening inside white (N155B), with a light pale purplish pink (65C) blush at the centre and with a large vivid yellow (15A) blotch on the dorsal and adjacent lobes; outside white (N155B), with a moderate purplish pink (65A) blush at the centre; lightly scented; stigmas absent; style pinkish red, with light green stigma. Calyx 3mm long, green. Lvs elliptic, 110 × 50mm, pointed at base and apex, with wavy margins, glossy above, with a few scales

below. Shrub 2.2 × 1.6m in 22 years. Late May to early June (in Latvia). Hardy to –30C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162869).

Etymology: named after the Latvian town of Brocēni

Fls 12/loose ball, open funnel-shaped, 45 × 70mm, with 7 very wavy-edged lobes, buds light purplish pink (55C), with light greenish yellow (8C) at base, opening inside light purplish pink (55C), with light greenish yellow (8C) at base and with a flared, strong red (53C) spotted blotch on the dorsal and adjacent lobes; outside strong purplish red (55B), with light greenish yellow (8C) undertones, shading to deep purplish pink (55A) at the midrib; filaments yellow, with brownish anthers; style yellow, with yellow stigma, ringed with red. Calyx 20–30mm long, outside light greenish yellow (8C), suffused with light purplish pink (55C); inside deeper yellow, with strong red (53C) at the margins. Lvs oblong, 120 × 35mm, narrowly rounded at base and apex, with wavy, decurved margins. Shrub 1.8–2.0 × 1.5m in 10 years. Mid-season (in Geraldine, New Zealand). Hardy. Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162582).

Etymology: named for the farm where the cultivar was grown.

Fls 10/domed truss, funnel-shaped, 64 × 76mm, with 5 wavy-edged lobes, buds vivid purplish red (61C), shading to pinkish white (N155B) at base, opening inside pinkish white (N155B), with basal flares of moderate red (47A) on the dorsal and adjacent lobes; outside pinkish white (N155B), shading to light purplish pink (55C) at the lobe centres; filaments white, with brown anthers; style pale green, with yellow-green stigma; unscented. Calyx 0.1mm long, strong yellow-green (144B). Lvs elliptic, 152–178 × 38–51mm, rounded at base, broadly acute at apex, with margins downcurved, moderate olive green (137B). Shrub 1.2 × 1.0m in 11 years. Midseason (early May in Philadelphia, USA area). Hardy to –18C. Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162792).

Etymology: named for a grandson of the hybridiser

cv. Elepidote rhododendron: *griffithianum* (s) X *barbartum*

Fls (6–)9(–15)/loose ball truss, broadly funnel-campanulate, 50–60 × 70–80mm, with 5 slightly wavy and emarginate lobes, buds vivid red (45C) shading to vivid red (46B), opening inside strong red (53C), then shading from deep pink (52B) at margins to deep purplish pink (54B) in the throat, eventually fading to pale purplish pink (56C) at the margins; outside vivid red (45C), shading to strong red (51A), paling through deep pink (52B), becoming light purplish pink (56C) at the base of the tube; 11–12 pink filaments, with dark anthers; style pink, with white, impressed stigma; ovary densely hairy; nectaries dark red. Calyx 10–15mm long, shading from moderate pink (49B) to light pink (49C), with strong pink (54C) at the margins, fading with maturity. Pedicels 25–30mm long. Lvs oblanceolate, 170–200 × 60–70mm, cuneate at base, mucronulate at apex, with margins decurved, matt above. Tree to 6.0 × 6.0m in 60–70 years, with peeling red-brown bark. April (in Herefordshire, UK). Hardy to –15C. Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162635).

Etymology: named for Captain George Johnstone of Trewithin, from whom William H. Banks received the plants

Fls semi-double to double, 2–3/terminal bud, 35 × 65mm, saucer-shaped, with 15–17 wavy-edged lobes, buds moderate purplish pink (66D), shading to white near base, opening inside white, with green at base and moderate purplish pink (66D) to strong purplish red (63B) at margins, with some sparse vivid purplish red (67B) spotting on the dorsal lobes; outside moderate purplish pink (66D), shading to white near base; stamens absent; style white, with green stigma; unscented. Calyx 7mm long, strong yellow-green (144C). Lvs elliptic, 25 × 11mm, cuneate at base, broadly acute at apex, with flat margins, moderate yellow-green (146B) above. Shrub 0.6 × 0.6m in 10 years. Midseason (late April in Washington D.C., USA area). Hardy to –18C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162789).

Etymology: named for the noted azalea specialist Carolyn Beck, a long time leader of the Azalea Society of America, author and propagator.

Fls 14/ball truss, funnel-shaped, 51 × 64mm, with 5 slightly wavy-edged lobes, buds strong red (53C) opening inside deep purplish pink (64D), with vivid reddish purple (74B) spots at the base of the dorsal lobe; outside vivid purplish red (74B); filaments white, with creamy white anthers; style white, with reddish pink stigma; unscented. Calyx apparently absent. Lvs elliptic, 200 × 65mm, cuneate at base, broadly acute at apex, with downcurved margins, moderate olive green (137A), glossy above. Shrub 2.6 × 2.1m in 22 years. Early (April in inland North Carolina, USA). Hardy to –23C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162774).

Etymology: named for the grand-nephew of the hybridiser’s wife

Fls double 10(–11)/domed truss, broadly funnel-shaped, 25 × 30mm, with 5 + 5 recurved, slightly wavy-edged and dentate lobes, buds pubescent, vivid red (45B) opening inside and outside strong reddish orange (42C), with a discreet yellow blotch at the base of the dorsal lobes; stamens absent; style red at base, shading to green at apex, with green stigma. Calyx 2mm long, pale green. Lvs elliptic, 40–60 × 20–25mm, cuneate at base, acute at apex, with flat margins, matt and pubescent. Shrub 0.6 × 0.4m in 5 years. May (in Brittany, France). Hardy to –15C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162888).

Etymology: Breton for “red devil”

Fls 7(–8)/loose truss, tubular funnel-shaped, 75–80 × 80mm, with 7 very wavy-edged and slightly emarginate lobes, buds light yellow (11B) to pale yellow (11C), opening inside white (155C), with light yellow (11B) at the base of the lobes and with touches of strong pink (50C) on the apices; outside white (155C); filaments pale yellow, anthers white; style and stigma pale green; faintly scented. Calyx insignificant. Lvs broadly ovate, 120–130 × 45–50mm, asymmetrical and slightly caudate at base, roundly acuminate at apex, with flat margins, new growth is dark red, becoming lime green and matt above. Shrub 2.5 × 2.0m in 14 years. Mid-June (in Limavady, Northern Ireland). Hardy to –15C.

Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162611).

Etymology: named for a hill, local to the registrant

(r) **'Dusty Gian'**

Fls 7/domed truss, broadly funnel-shaped, 67 × 95mm, with 8 slightly wavy-edged lobes, buds strong purplish red (67A), opening inside pinkish white (N155B), variably overlaid with strong purplish red (67A), particularly where the lobes join, becoming white and with a small dorsal flare opening dark reddish orange (175B), paling to light olive (152B); outside pinkish white (N155B), variably overlaid with strong purplish red (67A), particularly where the lobes join, becoming white; stamens 16, filaments whitish, shading to green at the ovary, anthers tan; style whitish, shading to green at the ovary, stigma green; strongly scented, with a honeydew melon fragrance. Normal calyx absent. Lvs elliptic, 108 × 38mm, rounded at base, acute at apex, with flat margins, moderate olive green (137A), semi-glossy, with raised lateral veins. Shrub 1.8 × 2.4m in 20 years. Midseason (early May, in Philadelphia, USA). Hardy to -18C.  
Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162626).

Fls 11/strongly domed truss, tubular funnel-shaped, 60 × 85mm, with 5 wavy-edged and neatly frilled lobes, buds vivid reddish orange (34A) opening inside vivid reddish orange (30A), with vivid yellowish pink (30C) in the centre and with a vivid orange-yellow (23A) blotch on the dorsal and adjacent lobes; outside vivid reddish orange (30A); filaments light orange-red, with yellow anthers; style light red, with green stigma. Calyx 5mm long, green. Lvs elliptic, 110 × 45mm, pointed at base and apex, with wavy margins, green and glossy above. Shrub 2.5 × 2.3m in 18 years. Late May to early June (in Latvia). Hardy to -30C.  
Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162870).  
Etymology: named in dedication to the Latvian Song Festival, per request of the Latvian branch of Swedbank

Fls 13-19/ball truss, broadly funnel-shaped, 55 × 85-90mm, with 5 wavy-edged and very frilly lobes, buds vivid purplish red (57D), opening inside strong purplish red (58C) when young, becoming strong purplish pink (73B), with a small flare of deep purplish red (59B) at the base of the dorsal lobes; outside vivid purplish red (57D) when young, becoming light purplish pink (62C), with light reddish purple (74C) at the margins; filaments white,

with dark brown anthers; style white, glandular on the bottom half, with dark red stigma; ovary hairy and glandular. Calyx 2-4mm long, greenish pink, with small hairs on the margins. Lvs broadly elliptic, 120-140 × 65-72mm, rounded at base, broadly acute at apex, with flat margins, dark green and glossy above. Shrub 0.9 × 1.1m in 6 years. Beginning of May (in northern France). Hardy to -15C.  
Nomenclatural standard: colour print provided by the registrant (WSY0162863).  
Etymology: named for a Breton whisky
