

# First-flowering dates

## First-flowering dates

- First-flowering dates are given in brackets following the name of the originator
- For registered cultivars (added to the Classified Lists in or after 1955), the first-flowering date is given only if it is ten years or more before the date of registration
- For pre-1955 cultivars, and later ones too if they are unregistered, first-flowering dates are given whenever possible. The date is sometimes known for certain but is often deduced from the earliest reference the RHS has to the cultivar or from some other associated date, for example the year of death of the originator. If so, the term pre- or c. is used to qualify it

## Rationales for first-flowering dates

- Rationales for first-flowering dates are given at the close of many cultivar entries - for example, the entry for 'Aachen' closes with "Added to Class. List in 1928"
- However, many entries close with no rationale
  - either* because the entry is for a registered cultivar, and the registrant can be assumed to have supplied the date of first flowering
  - or* because the rationale for the date of first flowering is evident from the date of an award
  - or* because the rationale may be found in the following list by looking up the first-flowering date - for example, look up a first-flowering date of pre-1877 to find that for a Leeds cultivar it derives from the death of Edward Leeds

*or* because the rationale may be found in the following list by looking up the name of the originator - for example, look up the originator name Hancock to find that the first-flowering date for a Hancock cultivar may derive from the last part of the seedling number

Brodie The last part of the seedling number indicates the date of the cross, which, plus 5 years, is the estimated date of first flowering

Crotty His seedling numbers of the 1970s and 80s indicate the date of first flowering

Hancock The last part of the seedling number indicates the date of first flowering

Jackson The last part of the seedling number indicates the date of first flowering

*or* because no rationale has been traced - for example, a number of entries with a first-flowering date of c.1966 may have been among many that were adopted by the RHS from the ADS Data Bank but had no background information attached (see page 19 for further notes on the ADS Data Bank)
